Appointment of First Apostolic Nuncia From Syro Malankara Catholic Church

On June 16 2023, Moron Mor Baselios Cardinal Cleemis, the Major Archbishop - Catholicos of Syro Malankara Catholic Church announced the decision of Pope Francis to appoint Monsignor Dr George Panamthundil, a member of the Syro-Malankara Catholic Major Archdiocese, the Apostolic Nuncio (Vatican as ambassador) to Kazakhistan and as Titular Archbishop of Floriana. He is the first priest from the Malankara Catholic Church to be appointed a Nuncio. He working was with the Vatican nunciature in Cyprus when the new appointment was announced.

His episcopal ordination was held on September 9 at St. Peter's Basilica Vatican.
