#### 3 lessons from the leper

Jesus stretches his arms and touches you “I am willing, .....

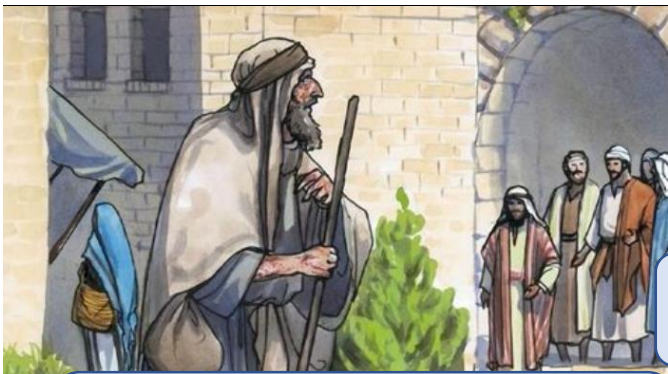

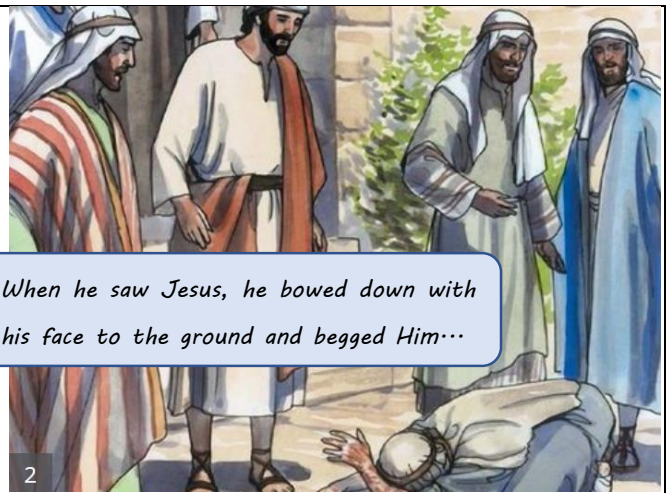

#### GARBO SUNDAY

Garbo Sunday or the Sunday of the leper is the second Sunday in the season of the Great Fast. The passage that is selected by the Church to be read as the Holy Gospel reading on Garbo Sunday is St. Luke 5: 12-16.



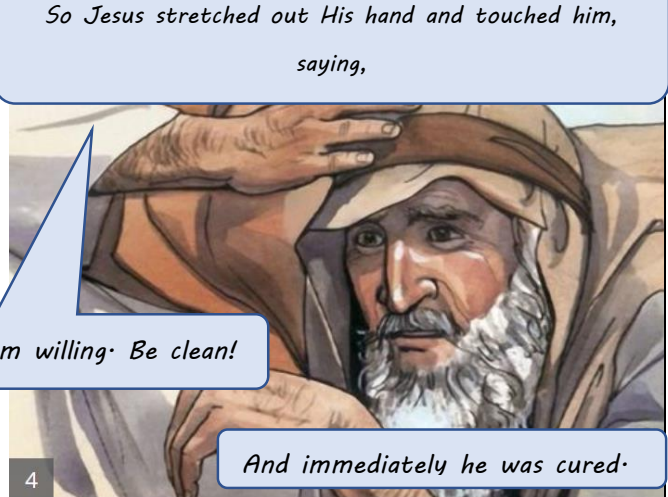
1 While Jesus was in one of the towns, a man came to Him who was covered with leprosy.



2 When he saw Jesus, he bowed down with his face to the ground and begged Him...



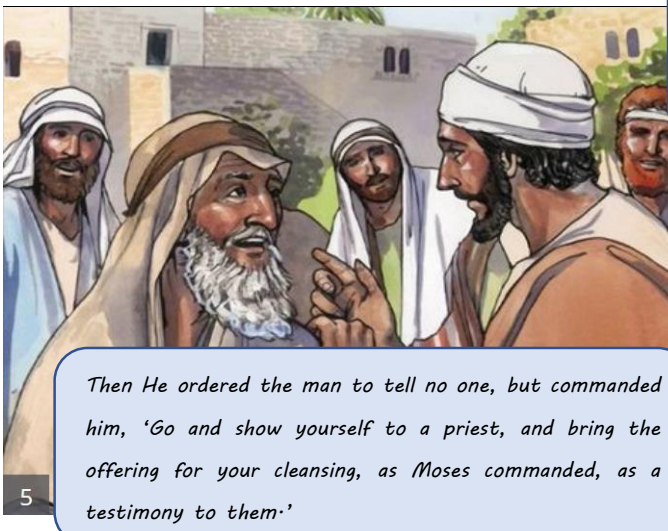
3 Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean.



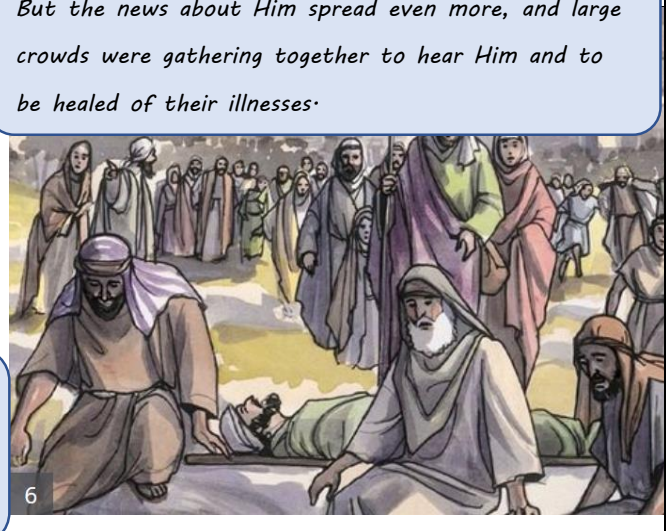
4 So Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him, saying,

I am willing. Be clean!

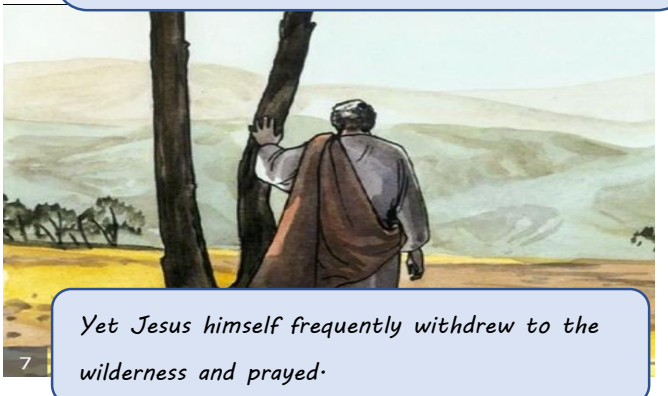
And immediately he was cured.



5 Then He ordered the man to tell no one, but commanded him, 'Go and show yourself to a priest, and bring the offering for your cleansing, as Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.'



6 But the news about Him spread even more, and large crowds were gathering together to hear Him and to be healed of their illnesses.



7 Yet Jesus himself frequently withdrew to the wilderness and prayed.

Jesus did not do miracles for his own glory. But, for the glory of the name of God or to accomplish the needs of those who confided in him. The primary intention of the miracles was the establishment of the Kingdom of God and the good of man.
